

## **Our Tour Guides Through ACTS**

**Joseph Addison Alexander** (1809-1860) Son of founder of Princeton Theological Seminary, where he too taught, knew over 20 languages and wrote still definitive commentaries on Psalms, Isaiah, Acts, Matthew and Mark

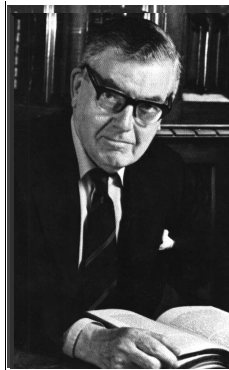
**E.M. Blaiklock** Professor of Classics, University of Auckland, New Zealand. Wrote *Archaeology Of the New Testament* and collaborated on several key scholarly reference works

**Frederick Fyvie Bruce** (1910-1990) Brethren upbringing, worshipped in little Brethren church in Stockport. Rylands chair of Biblical Criticism and Exegesis at University of Manchester (1959-78). Perhaps the outstanding conservative NT scholar of postwar generation

**Richard C.H. Lenski** German-born American Lutheran scholar, wrote massive commentary on entire NT

**Richard N. Longenecker** Longtime Professor of New Testament at Wycliffe College, Toronto. Now at McMaster. Also taught at Trinity Evangelical Divinity School. Ph.D at Edinburgh University. Specialist in Paul, about whom he has written several books and articles. Also *The Christology of Early Jewish Christianity*

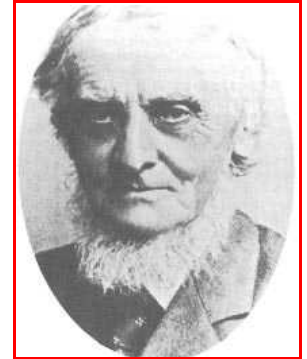
**John Gresham Machen** (1881-1937) One of the greatest apologetists for the Christian faith of this or any other century. Wrote *Christianity and Liberalism*, *The Origin of Paul's Religion*, *The Virgin Birth of Christ*. Taught New Testament at Princeton and was among

the founders of Westminster Theological Seminary, after Princeton's liberalizing drove him out. No doubt premature death caused by exertions for orthodoxy

**Alexander MacLaren** (1826-1910) Glasgow-born Baptist preacher. Next to Spurgeon, responsible for the most widely-read sermons of his time. North of England's outstanding preacher in Victorian era. His *Expositions* of all the Bible books are coveted

**I. Howard Marshall** One of the great NT scholars of our generation, from Methodist background. Has taught at University of Aberdeen

**G. Campbell Morgan** (1863-1945) British Congregational minister, wrote best-selling expositions on most of NT and much of OT, dozens of other books still in demand

**Arthur Tappan Pierson** (1837-1911) Presbyterian pastor, writer. Stood in for Spurgeon at Metropolitan Tabernacle. Editor of *Missionary Review of the World*. Many books including *Acts of the Holy Spirit*

**Richard B. Rackham** Anglican scholar, but wrote only one commentary -- his classic on *Acts*

**Sir William M. Ramsay** (1851-1939) Knighted for his outstanding contributions to Near Eastern archaeology, Ramsay began his work convinced of the **unreliability** of the New Testament. The accuracy of *Acts* convinced him otherwise. Devoted next 40 years to vindicating the historical trustworthiness of the NT

**W. Graham Scroggie** (1877-1959) Scot minister and writer. Preached at Spurgeon's Tabernacle from 1938 to 1944. Noted works include *Know Your Bible* and *The Unfolding Drama of Redemption*
